Here-to-there Worship Leading (Part 1)

When we ask someone to lead, we're expecting that leader to take us somewhere. The assumption is that leaders take their followers from one place - here - to a destination, of sorts - there. So, why wouldn't we expect such a thing from our worship leaders? What the church needs is more pastoral worship leaders, who understand not only the musical side of worship, but more importantly, the liturgical and theological aspect of leading a congregation to an experience with a Holy God, all the while being strategic in their planning. We need our worship leaders to lead us in such a way that brings movement to the biblical truth that is being communicated in the time that we are together as a congregation. It should, ideally, be a synergistic experience with the Word being shared by the pastor, and the movement of the Holy Spirit in celebration.

Here-to-there Worship Leading (Part 2)

This workshop begins the conversation in which we engage worship leaders as strategic planners, pastors, and theologians, and work through WHAT we need to do and HOW we plan a service to accomplish it! It's hard work, but it is necessary work. Hopefully, it will be a paradigm shift for worship leaders to view the work they do as Biblically-based strategy, to bring the people of God from here to there in one hour, which may be life transformative. And not because of the music, but because the experience was in lock and step with what God's Spirit was already preparing to do!

Fundamentals of Musical Terminology & Finding Your Voice Range

After touching upon fundamental vocabulary (What is melody? What is harmony? Even if you don't read sheet music, what clues can you find if given a piece of written music?), participants will also learn the ranges of their voices to better support their growth in their respective music ministries.

Harmonizing and Ear Training

Within each singers range we will work on ear training and discerning harmonies. How to tell the difference between major and minor chords?
